They are in constant need of diapers, clothes, and food donations. They are also in need of providing facility repair to the 100-year-old structure the shelter occupies. The second shelter is Union Mission, Roanoke Rapids, a regional shelter that provides daily food to the community, educational services, and serves as a homeless shelter for men. They are in need of food donations, facility repairs like painting, new mattresses in the dormitory, clothing, and volunteers to help provide educational services to the community. The men in the homeless shelter would benefit from sheets, towels, and pillows. Also, community gardens will begin in different towns in the area. Churches can get involved through the whole process from planting to harvesting to food distribution.
