



HUNGER FUND

GUIDELINES

Applications are reviewed at quarterly meetings.

Purpose

The CBFNC Hunger Fund assists North Carolina churches and organizations that offer hunger relief services within the state.

Objectives

1. To make funds available to churches and organizations for the purchase and distribution of food to North Carolina residents who are hungry or at risk for hunger.
2. To make funds available to churches and organizations that provide education or training designed to enable North Carolina residents who are hungry or at risk for hunger to feed themselves.

Requirements for Application

1. An application must be filled out in its entirety and submitted online at <https://cbfnc.org/embrace/grants>.
2. Agreement that if funds are distributed based on your application, you must submit a follow-up email 6 months after receiving funds with updates, pictures, stories, etc. to agallaher@cbfnc.org.
3. Agreement that any funds received as part of your application must be used for the ministry in the application. Do not reallocate given funds to another ministry area.

Implementation

1. The CBFNC Missions Engagement Ministry Team will distribute monies received from donations for applications received.
2. Funds will be distributed to any North Carolina hunger relief agency with preference given to CBFNC churches and regional networks.
3. Requests will be considered and acted upon by the CBFNC Missions Engagement Ministry Team at quarterly meetings.
4. Care will be taken to assure that funds are used to assist as many ministries as possible in a meaningful way.
5. Repeat applications are welcomed but not guaranteed funding.
6. Further guidelines designed to ensure fair allocation of funds may be implemented by the CBFNC Missions Engagement Ministry Team.
7. The CBFNC Hunger Fund exists solely on donations made to it. The team will continue to allocate funds as long as monies exist.

Types of Services Supported

1. Educational opportunities and materials designed to address hunger relief.
2. Enabling food production, food distribution, or food consumption, including the cost of materials and equipment (either rental or purchase).
3. Direct purchase of food for hunger relief.
