Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina's Hunger Fund Guidelines

Purpose

The CBFNC Hunger Fund assists churches and organizations that offer hunger relief services in North Carolina.

Objectives

- 1. To make funds available to churches and organizations for the purchase and distribution of food to North Carolina residents who are hungry or at risk for hunger.
- To make funds available to churches and organizations that provide education or training designed to enable North Carolina residents who are hungry or at risk for hunger to feed themselves.

Implementation

- 1. The CBFNC Hunger Fund will distribute moneys received from donations.
- 2. Funds will be distributed to any North Carolina hunger relief agency with preference given to CBFNC churches and regional networks.
- 3. Requests will be considered an acted upon by the Wealth and Poverty Committee of CBFNC.
- 4. An annual report of allocations and project descriptions will be made to the Coordinating Council of CBFNC. These reports shall protect the privacy of individuals who benefit from the funds.
- 5. Care will be taken to assure that funds are used to assist as many ministries as possible in a meaningful way.
- 6. Repeat applications are welcomed but not guaranteed funding.
- 7. Further guidelines designed to ensure fair allocation of funds may be implemented by the Wealth and Poverty Committee of CBFNC.

Types of Services Supported

- 1. Educational opportunities and materials designed to address hunger relief.
- 2. Enabling food production, food distribution, or food consumption, including the cost of materials and equipment (either rental or purchase.)
- 3. Direct purchase of food for hunger relief.
